Simplicity Chocolate Cake Recipe - Class 65 (see page 7):

<u>Ingredients:</u> 3 tablespoons butter, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk, 1 cup self-raising flour, 2 tablespoons cocoa, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon vanilla essence, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs.

<u>Method:</u> Place all ingredients, except the butter, into a bowl. Pour in melted butter and beat with electric beater on high for 3 minutes. Pour mixture into a prepared tin and bake at 180°C until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean (approximately 50mins). Ice with chocolate glace icing.

<u>Chocolate Glace Icing:</u> 1 cup icing sugar, 2 tablespoons cocoa, 1 teaspoon soft butter, 1 tablespoon milk. Sift sugar and cocoa. Add butter and milk. Beat well.
